Coil Pots

Coil pots were common among the Southwestern Indigenous Tribes.

Most of the oldest coil pots that have been recovered were
made by three different pre-Columbian tribes/cultures - the Anasazi
(ancestors to the Pueblo people), the Mogollon, and the Hohokam.

Materials: Modeling Magic/Polymer Clay/Modeling Clay, tools to roll and cut the clay, foil

Instructions:

- 1. Knead the clay and get it warmed up to work with.
- 2. Roll a large piece of the clay (about 1x3 inches) into a ball and flatten it to make the base of the pot. Set aside.
- 3. Knead and roll a large piece of clay horizontally to begin making the coils. Roll it out until there is a long strand of clay.
- 4. Wrap the long strand of clay around the base in layers. Use your fingers to gently press together the separate layers.
